## Unreal Conditions

To make predictions, you may find unreal conditional clauses useful. Unreal conditions are either impossible or unlikely to be realized. In unreal conditional sentences, a contrary-to-fact condition exists.





### Example

#### Present Time:

If this *was allowed* to happen, the dam *would* collapse.

If the dam *collapsed*, many acres of good farmland *would disappear*.





### Example

#### Past Time:

If this *had not been allowed* to happen, the dam *would not have collapsed*.





## Example

### Past Time with Present or Future Result:

If they *had passed the law*, the economy *would be* in better shape now.

Example

If the weather is warm, I *will go* swimming.

If the weather were warm, I would go swimming.

If the weather had been warm, I would have gone swimming.

1. If I have time, I will write some letters.

If I had time, I would write some letters.

If I had had time, I would have written some letters.
